
The youngest referee the as-

He grew up in a boxing loving family because his dad was also a boxer himself and he was running his own boxing gym called Texas Boxing Club, he started to take boxing serious in 1986 after winning his first fight. At the time around Tembisa, it was him and Jerry Skhosana (Orlando Pirates) who were putting Tembisa on the map in terms of sports, he fought boxers like Baby Jacky Matlala three times and lost once, draw one and won one of those bouts. "I

fought a lot of good boxers in my career; I fought the likes of Herald Isaacs, Dingaan Thobela, Tony Lopez and others.

After fighting Tony Lopez in America I decided to return because I wanted to further my boxing career that side. I had a relationship with a white girl by the name of Jollen and is the one who made my move abroad possible because I used his home address to go there.

I went abroad on my own without a manager, promoter or what so ever. I once slept in a boxing gym because I had nowhere to go. But I later managed to get the right boxing people who helped me to take my boxing career forward. I moved from one country to another and the likes of Australia and others. Towards the new dispensation, I decided to come back home in 1994 and I continued my boxing career until I retired in 1995/1996.

I will also like to take this opportunity to thank all South African people for their support all these years and especially the people of Tembisa, I am what I am today and have what I have because of the people of Tembisa. These days I enjoy my life by playing golf with my friends the likes of Brian Baloyi and others.

RUGBY – Samoa stun Fiji 29-26 to be crowned the champions of the HBSC World Paris Sevens on Sunday at the Stade Jean Bouin in France. Samoa came from behind to shock the current series leaders Fiji in the final.

The Samoans victory was revenge after they were beaten by Fiji at the group stage. The Paris champions did the unthinkable by coming from the dead to defeat Fiji. Fiji was leading 26-7 at one stage but Samoa bounced back to secure their first title cup since 2012. The last time Samoa won the Sevens tournament was in Dubai for the Dubai sevens. Despite the defeat Fiji still lead by 14 points ahead of South Africa in the series standing with one tournament left. France marked their return to tournament with a third place finish at the home sevens tournament.

The host marked exactly 10 years absence in the competition; however they beat Argentina 26-17 to claim the third spot. South Africa sevens team secured the plate after beating Australia and New Zealand 29-19 on the way to the final. Fiji leads the series with 166 points while Springbok sevens are second with 152 points. The next and last HBSC World sevens tournament leads to London.

MOTORSPORT

Max Verstappen claimed his first win in the Formula One race of the Spanish Grand Prix at the Catalunya Circuit on Sunday.

The former Toro Rosso driver recorded his first victory this year from the dominance of Mercedes' Nico Rosberg. The Dutch Verstappen won the race clocking one hour 40 minutes 40.017 seconds ahead of the Ferrari Kimi Raikkonen. The 18-year-old recently got promoted two weeks ago and went on to beat Kimi Raikkonen who is twice his age.

The sensational Spanish Grand Prix saw the dominant Mercedes driver Lewis Hamilton and Nico Rosberg crush out of the race in the first lap. Kimi Raikkonen finished second ahead of Sebastian Vettel. He is second position on the driver standings behind the leader Nico Rosberg. The next race leads to Monaco for the Monaco Grand Prix on the 26 of May.

FOOTBALL

Pirates became the first team to advance to the final of the Nedbank Cup by defeating Free State Stars 4-2 on Saturday afternoon at the Goble Park Stadium.

A brace from Luvuyo Memela inspired the mighty Buccaneers to the final. Free State Stars midfielder Lucky Mohomi stabbed home for an opener from a well taken Luvuyo Memela free kick. Man of the match Luvuyo Memela increased the lead with a cool finish just outside the box, beating Johnny Mathole at the far post. In the second half, Ella Koto came back stronger and reduced the deficit with Ayanda Nkosi's close range tap in. Luvuyo Memela capped off a great performance with his second goal to conclude the brace and man of the match performance.

Thamsanqa Gabuza came from the bench to put the final of the coffin of Free State Stars. Lucky Mohomi redeemed himself by scoring the second goal for Free State Stars and put respectability on the score board.

Supersport United ended Baroka FC fairytale run in the Nedbank Cup. Matsatsantsa defeated Baroka FC 2-0 in the second semi-final of the Nedbank Cup on Saturday night at the Lucas Moripe Stadium. Goals from Bradley Grobler and Thuso Phala booked the spot in the Nedbank Cup final. Two second half goals were enough to silence the confident Baroka FC. Orlando Pirates will play Supersport United in the final of the Nedbank Cup on the 28 of May at Peter Mokaba Stadium.
